



Choose Your News

Really Simple Syndication (or RSS) allows you to choose the ARM news that interests you.

- View updates at your convenience
- Add news from other websites
- Mark news as "read" so it doesn't appear next time
- Sort your news and share it



Example reader: RSS is a way to get a quick list of the latest story headlines from your favorite websites and blogs.



Look for an RSS symbol on a website, blog, or browser window to "subscribe" to an RSS list feed.

RSS makes it a lot easier and faster for you to get the stories you care about from around the Web.



STOP THE SPAMNESS!

Q: Are you feeling spammed by "armall" email messages?

You are not alone. Many of these messages fall under the News Center categories.

A: To save your inbox (and your sanity!), the ARM Communications Team is implementing a new approach to compile these messages into a "roundup" format to be distributed weekly.

Q: Did you really want your message to reach "armall"?

Messages to "armall" go to the 2500 people from all over the world whose names are in the ARM people database. This should be considered an external audience so your message might be better suited for the News Center.

A: When you have something to tell the ARM community, consider who should get the message; there are several distribution lists to choose from.


- **armall**
Everyone in the people database; treat as an external audience
- **armcore**
Program management, principal investigators, and infrastructure staff
- **News Center**
Let folks read about it on the website or through their RSS reader.

Using RSS Readers


Most web browsers allow you to view RSS feeds just by clicking on the RSS icon. For advanced functions like email, sorting, marking as read, and sharing, you will need to pick an RSS aggregator, like Google Reader, BlogBridge, or FeedReader.

1. Select a news reader


Examples:



Google Reader (no software needed)



Internet Explorer (built-in reader)



Safari to Mac Mail (no software needed)

2. Look for the RSS icon to "feed" your reader
3. Click it, and paste the URL into your chosen reader
4. News is delivered to your reader!
